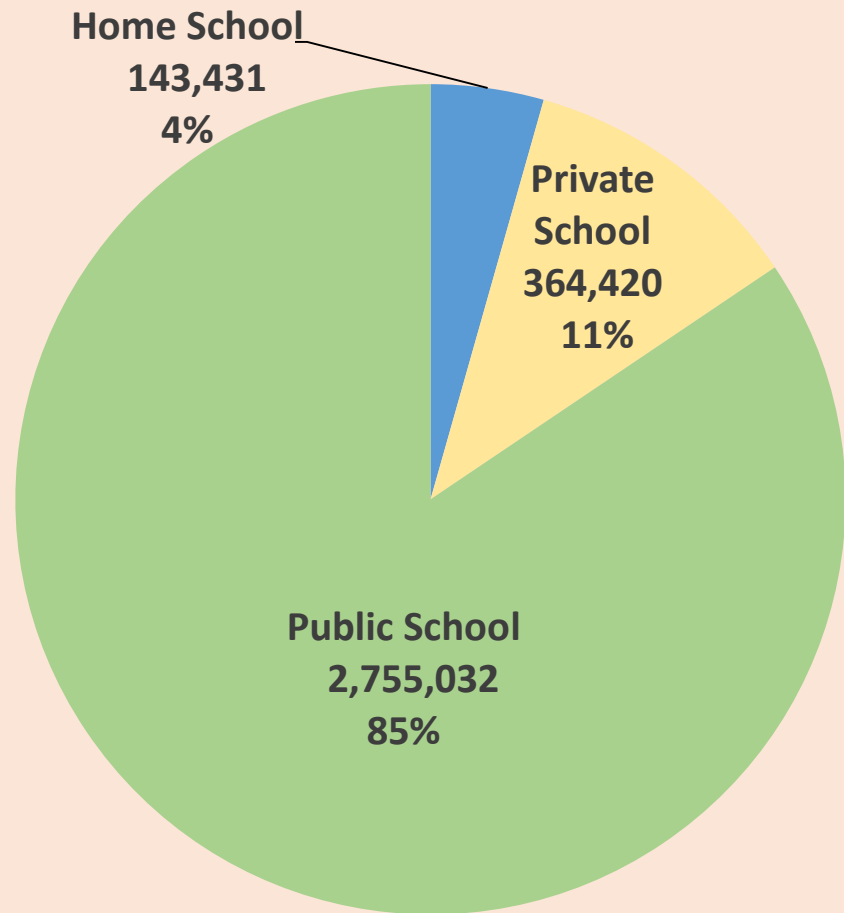

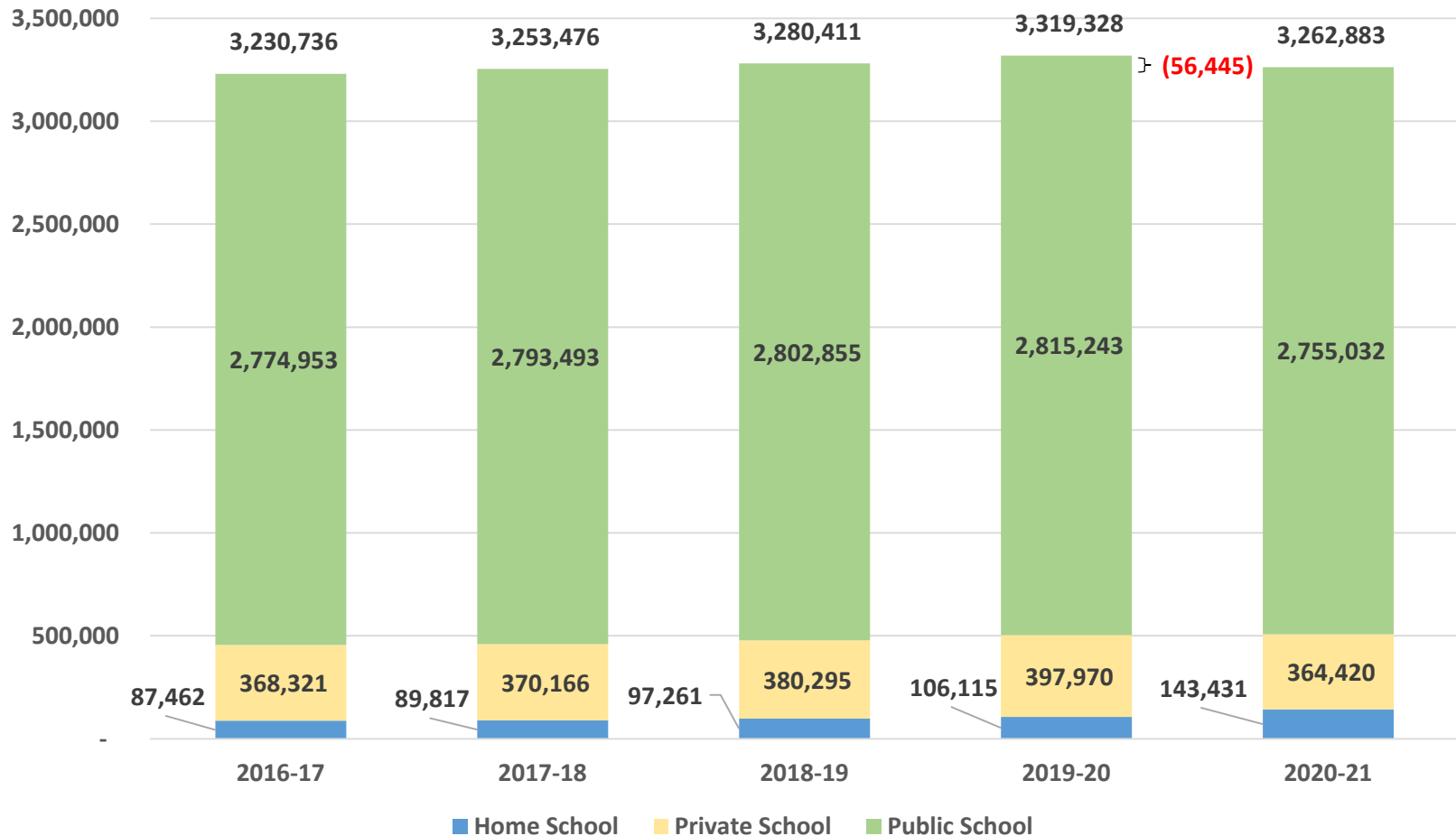

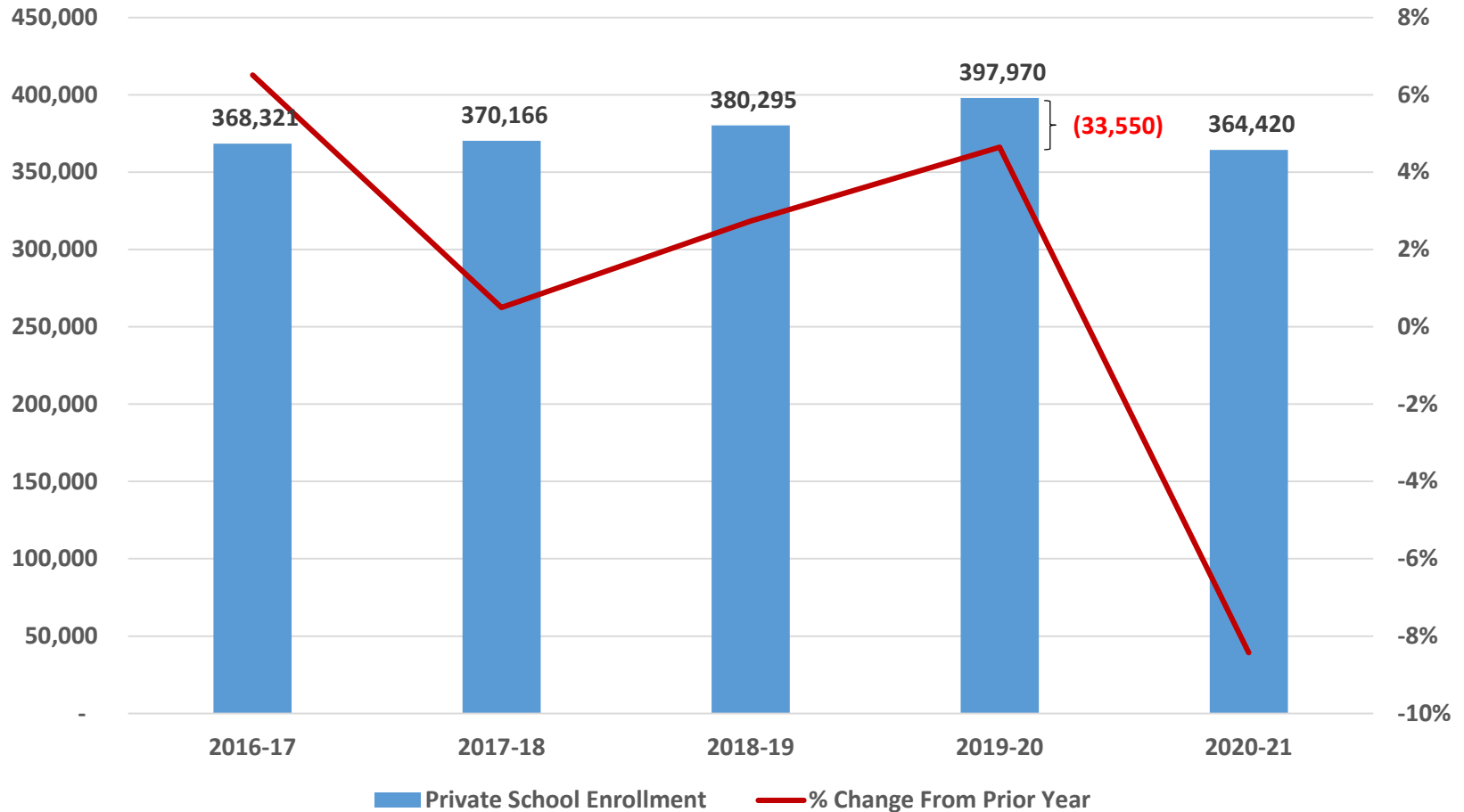

5-Year History of Enrollments



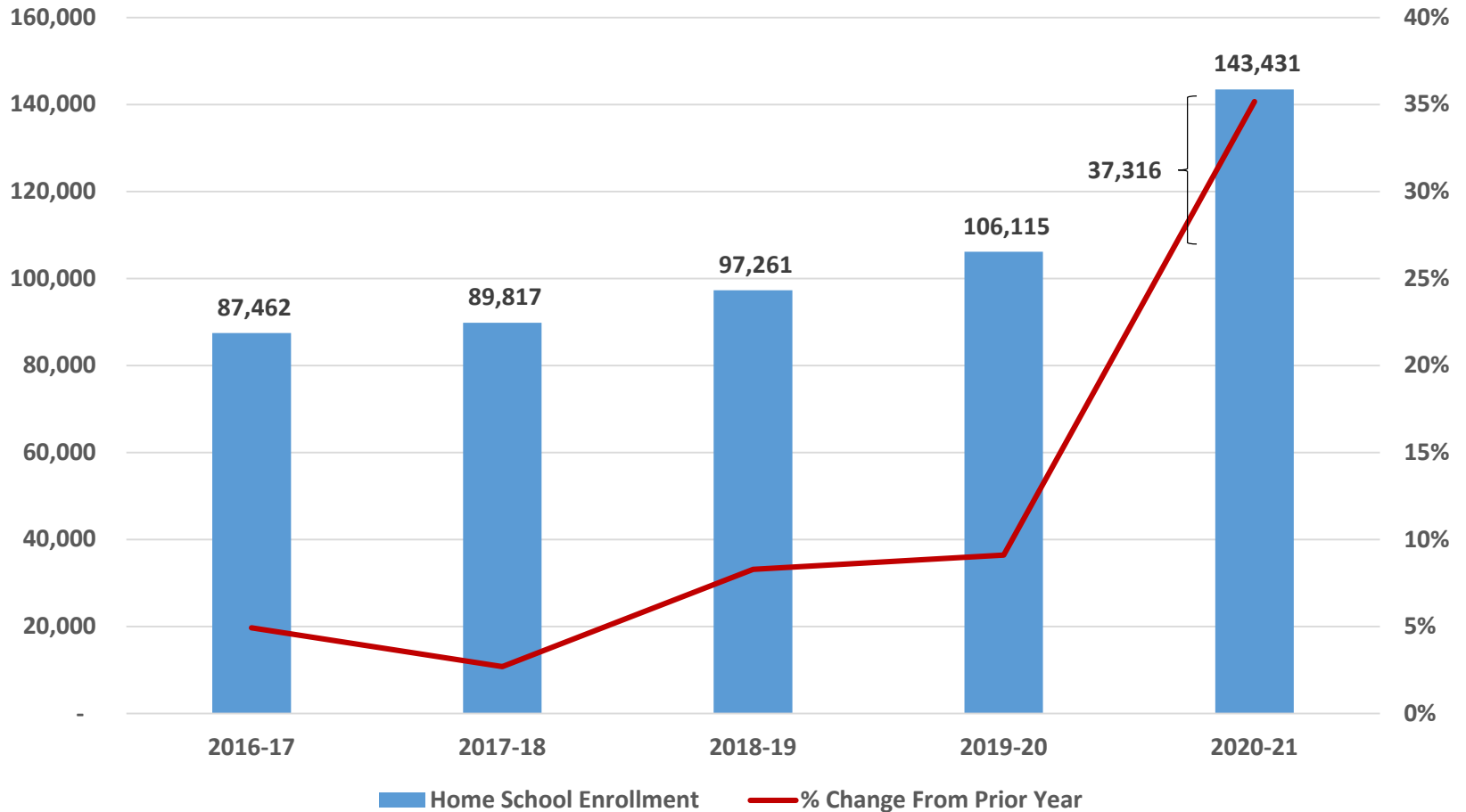

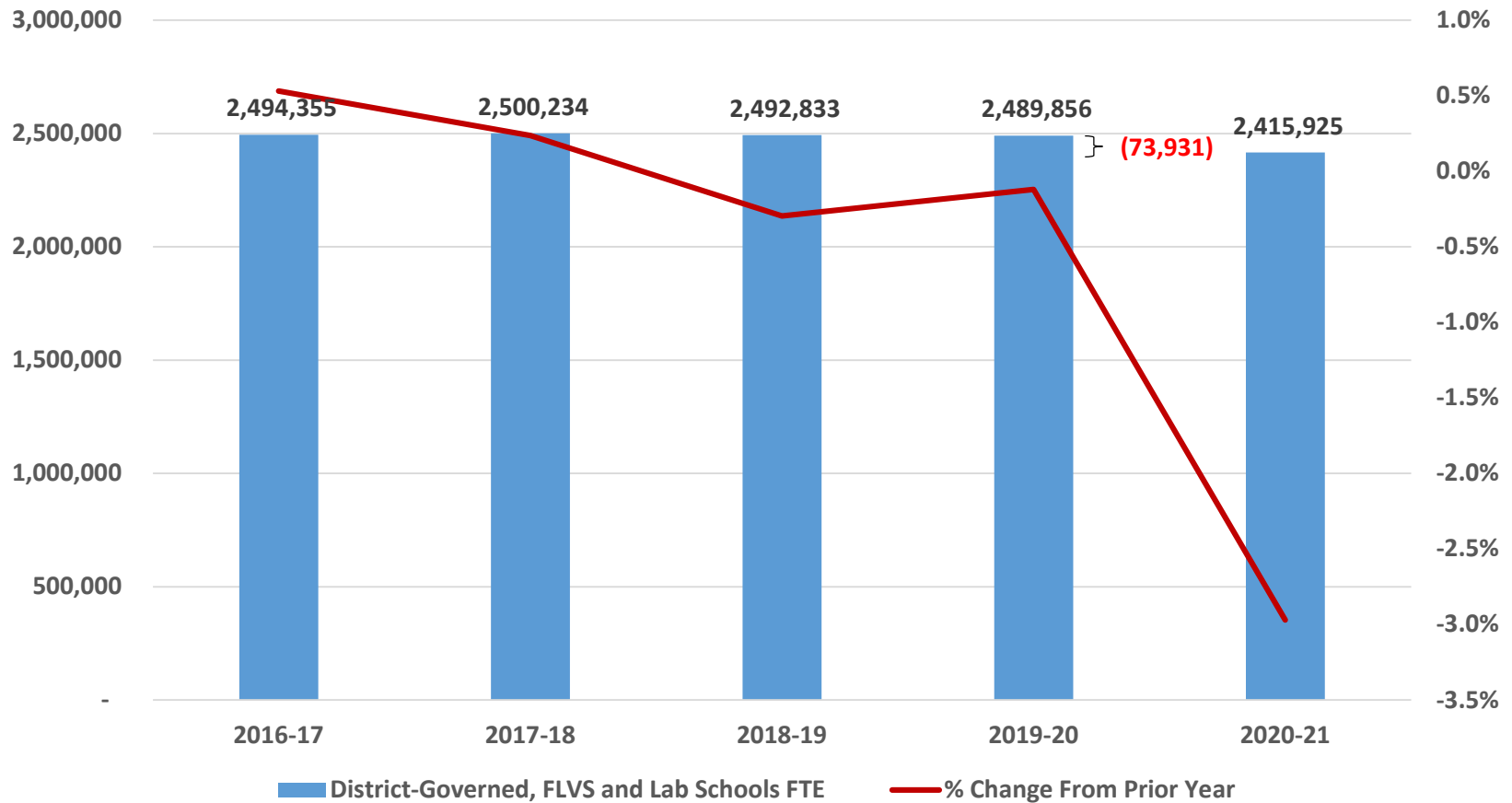

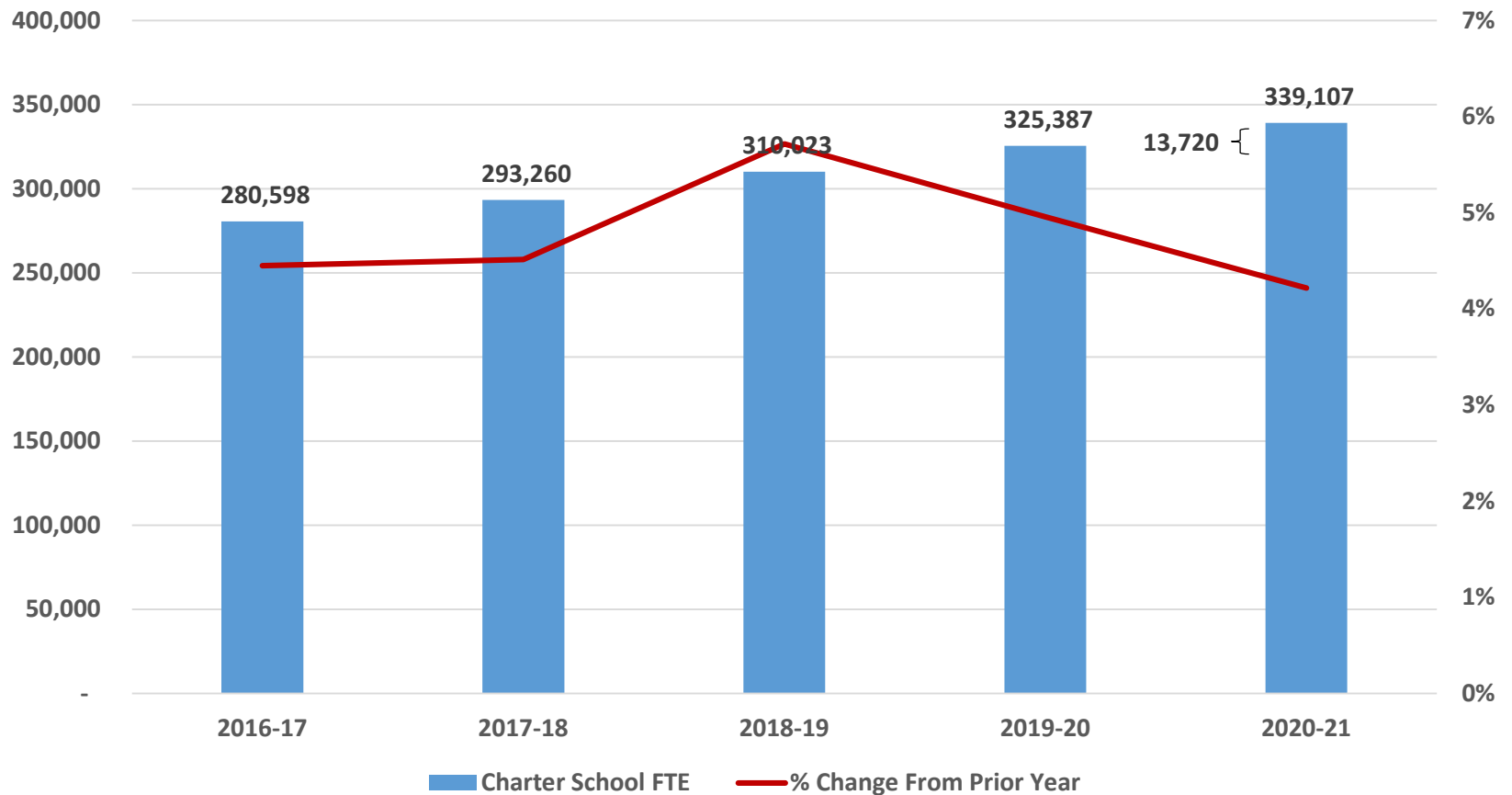

5-Year History of District-Governed, FLVS and Lab Schools FTE



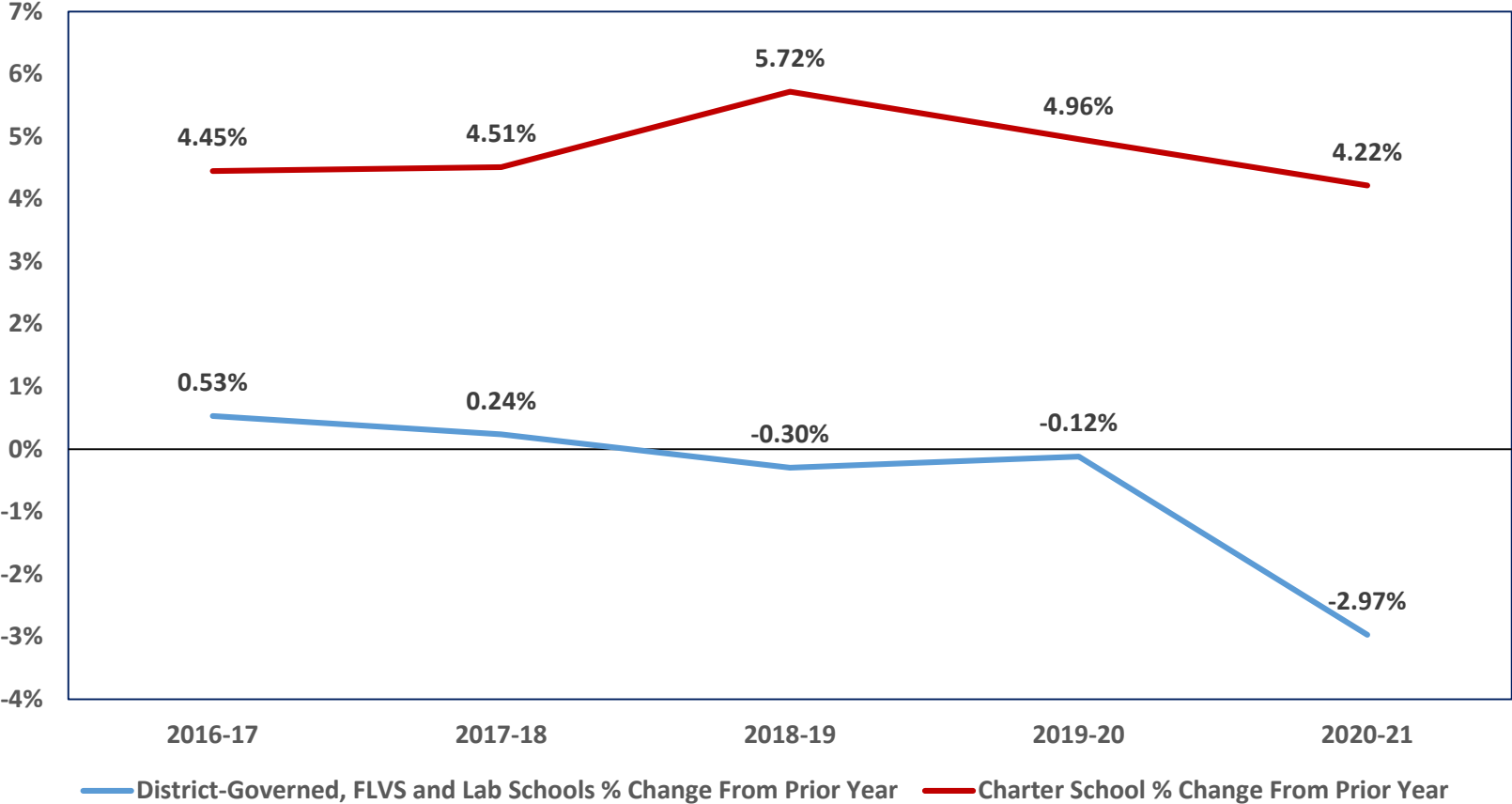

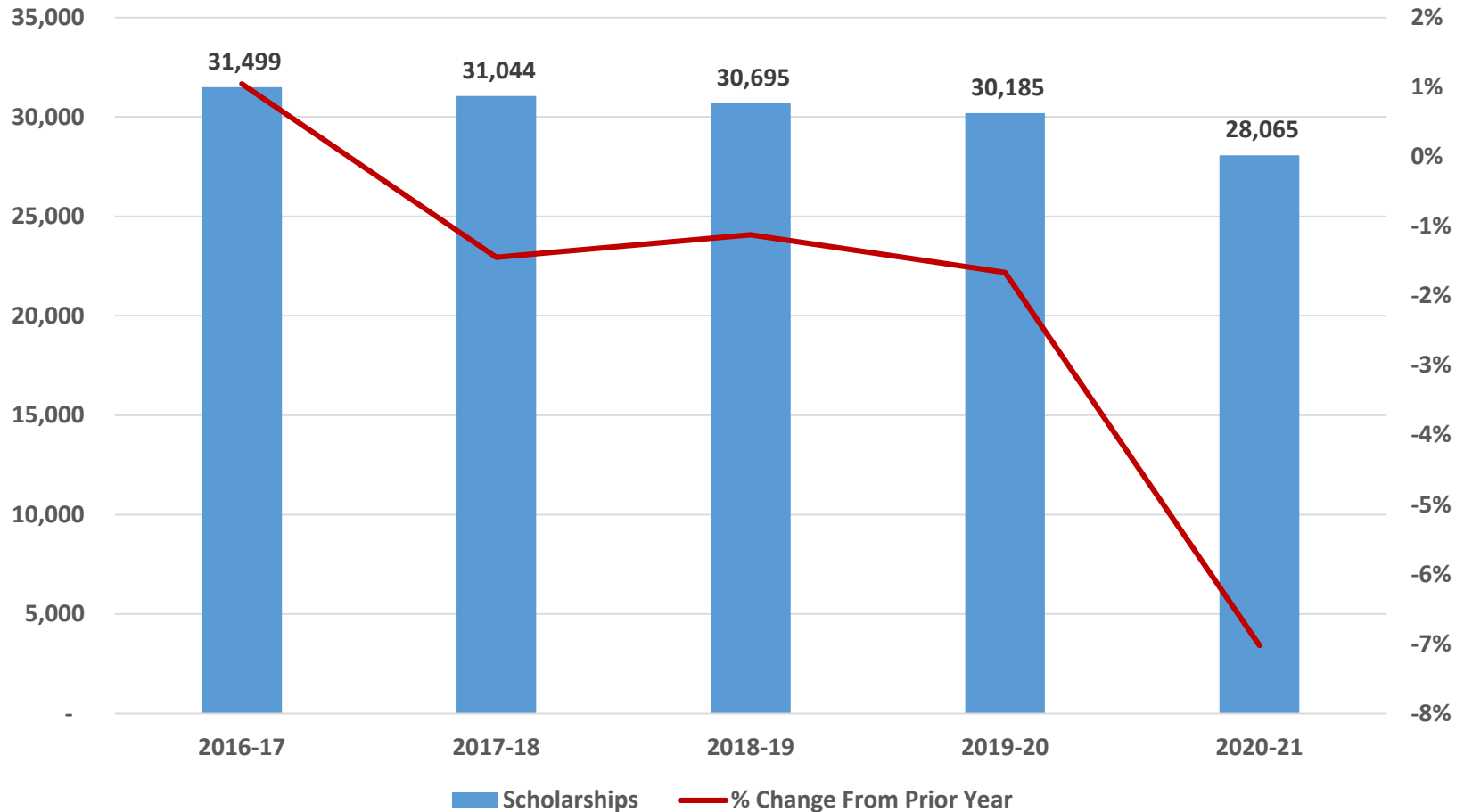

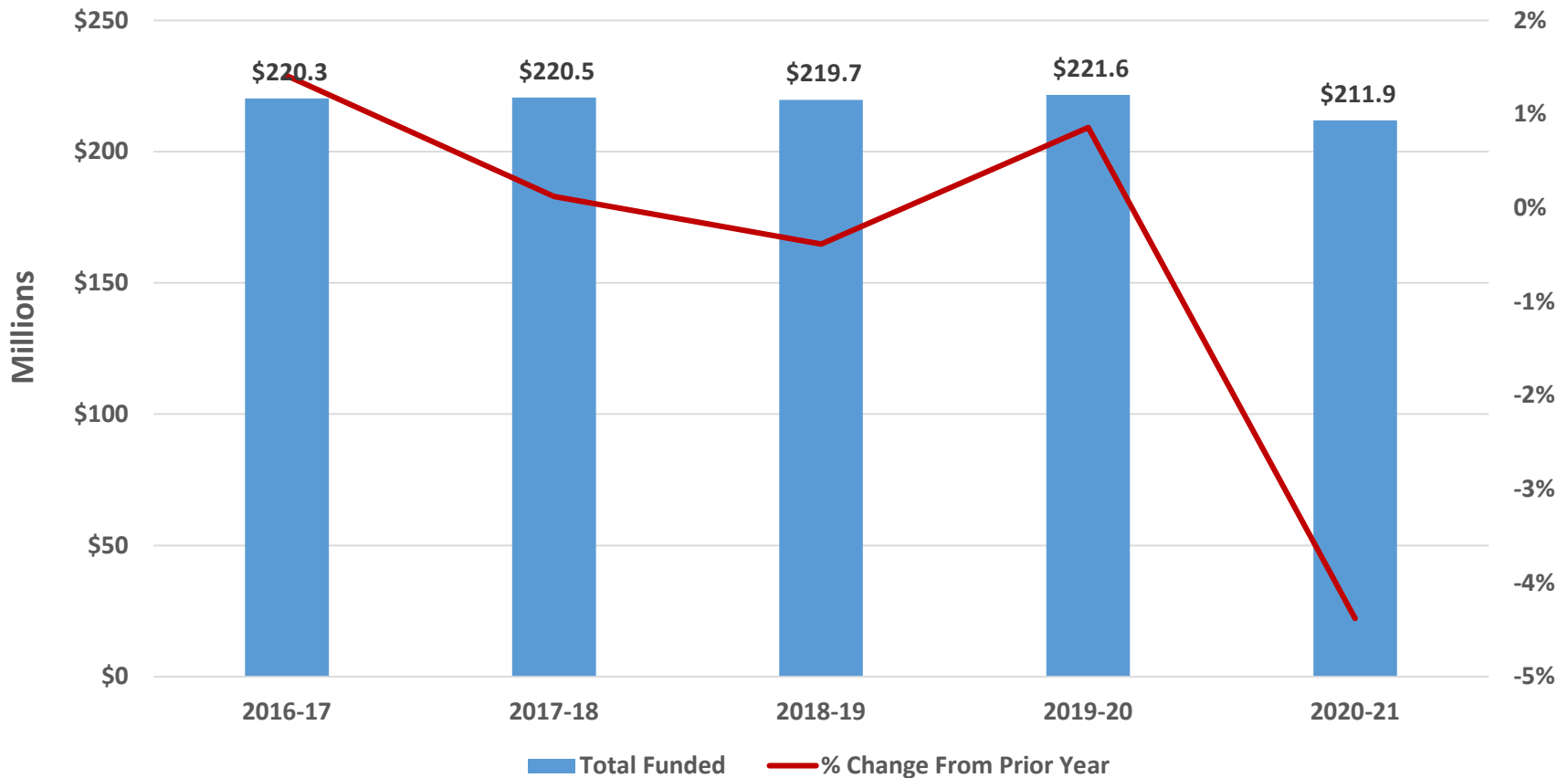

5-Year History of McKay Scholarship Students



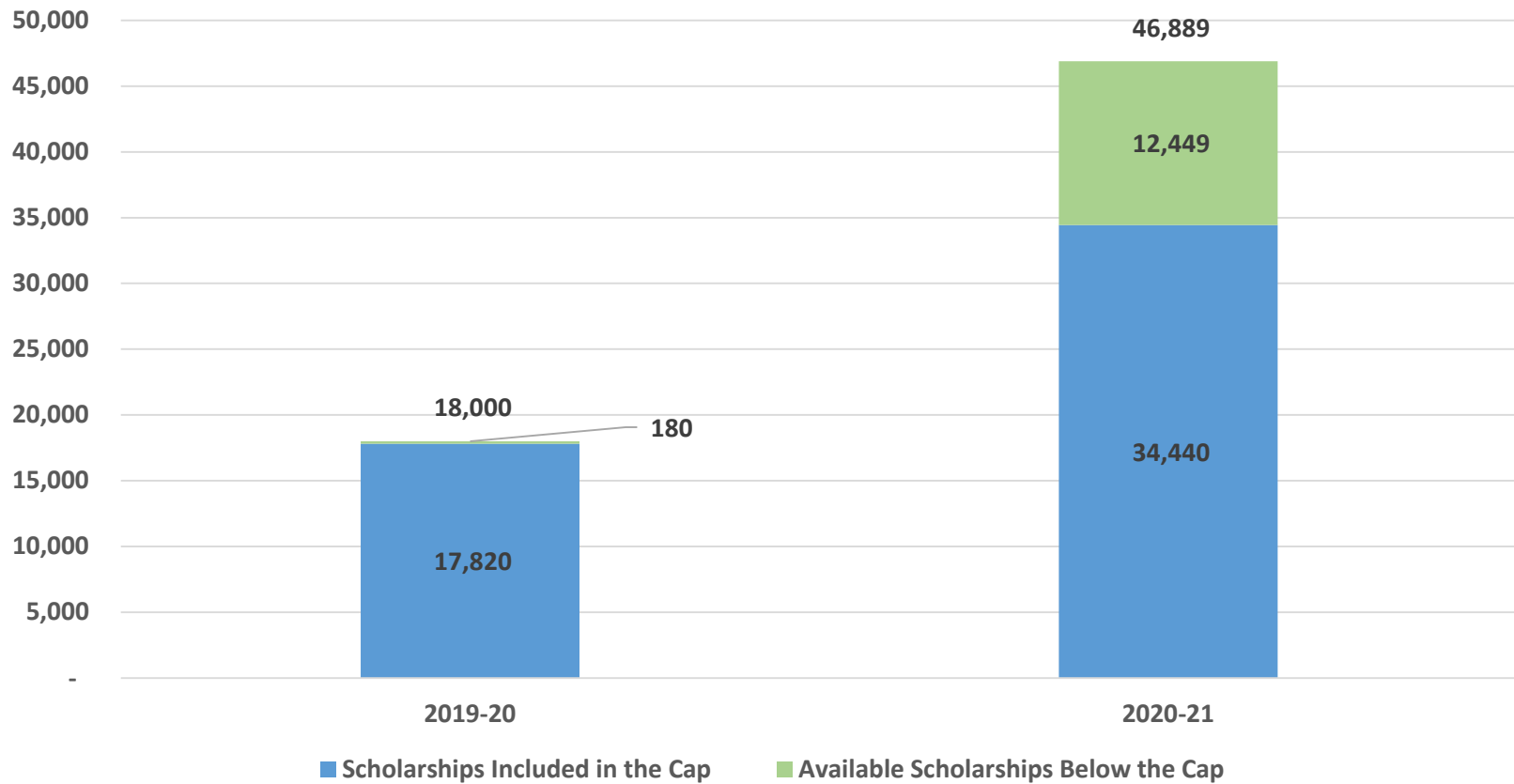

5-Year History of McKay Scholarship Funding



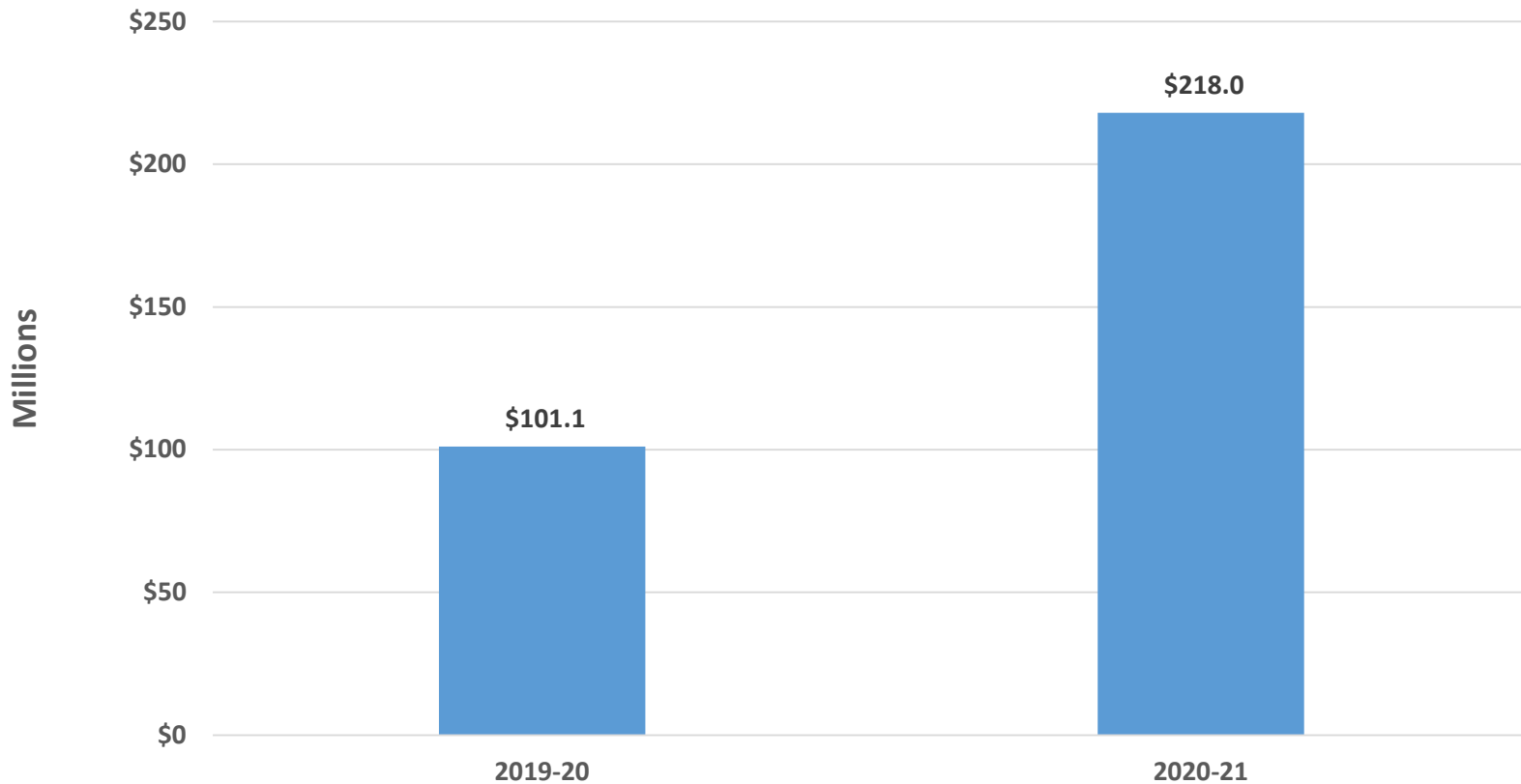

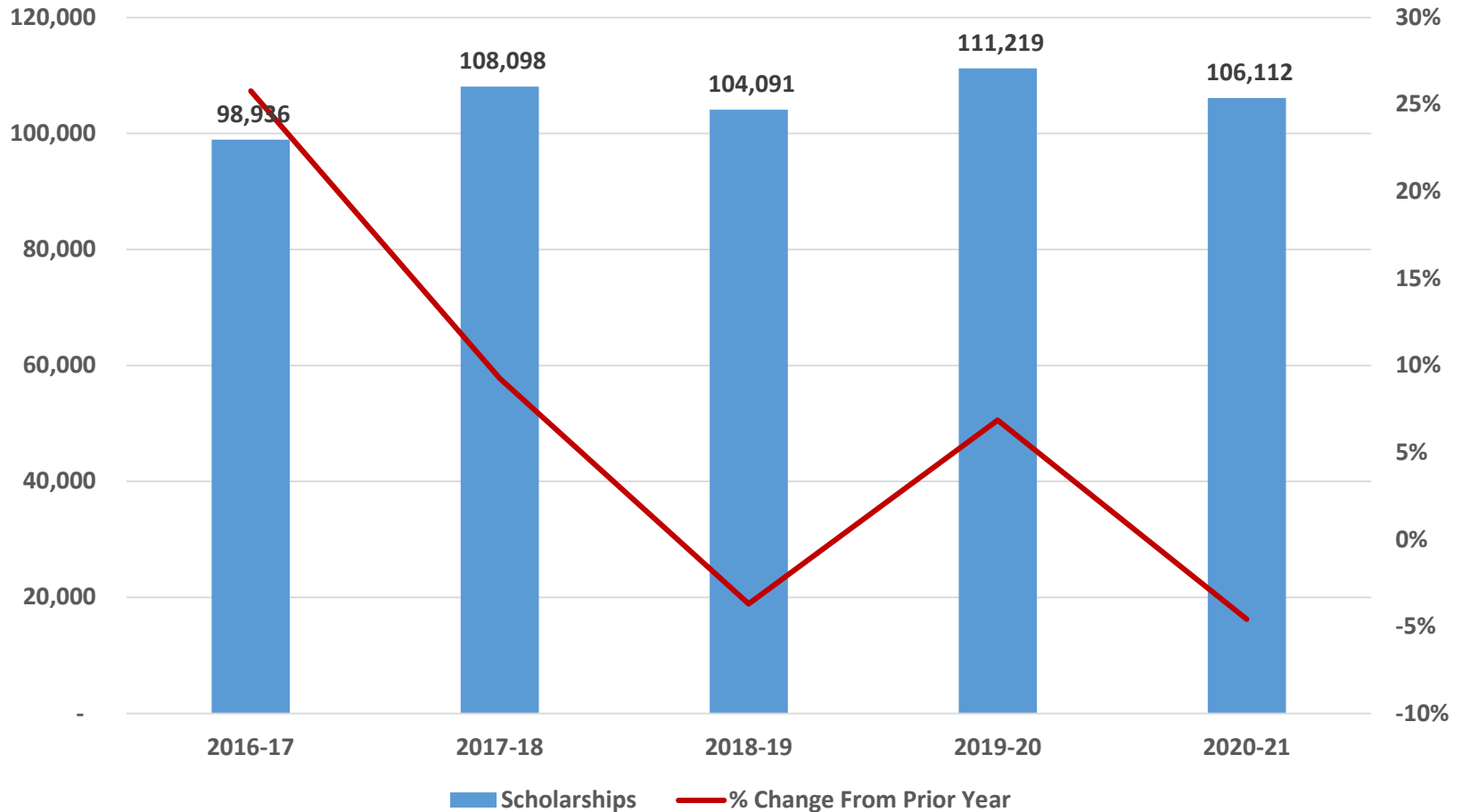

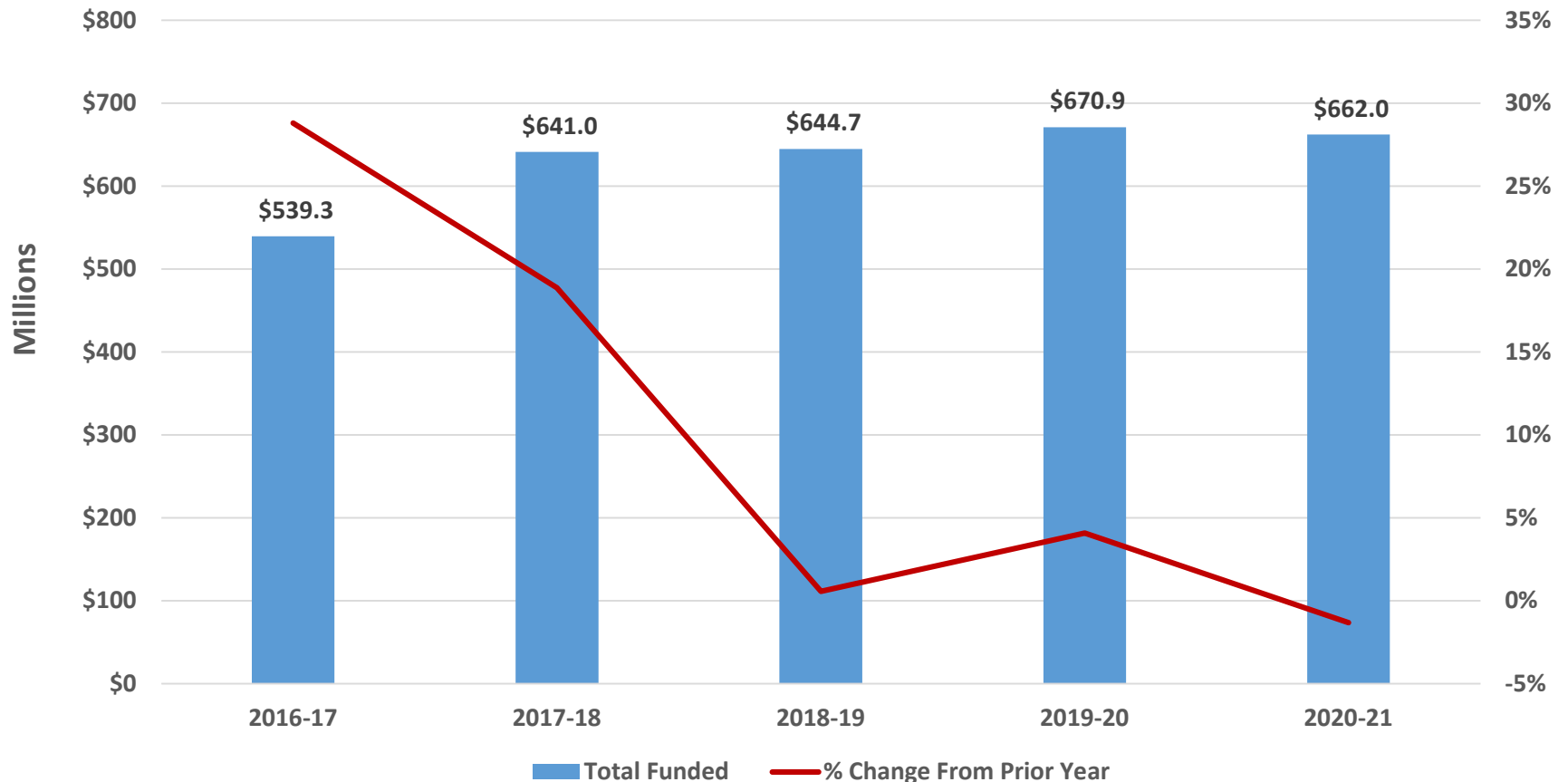

5-Year History of Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Students

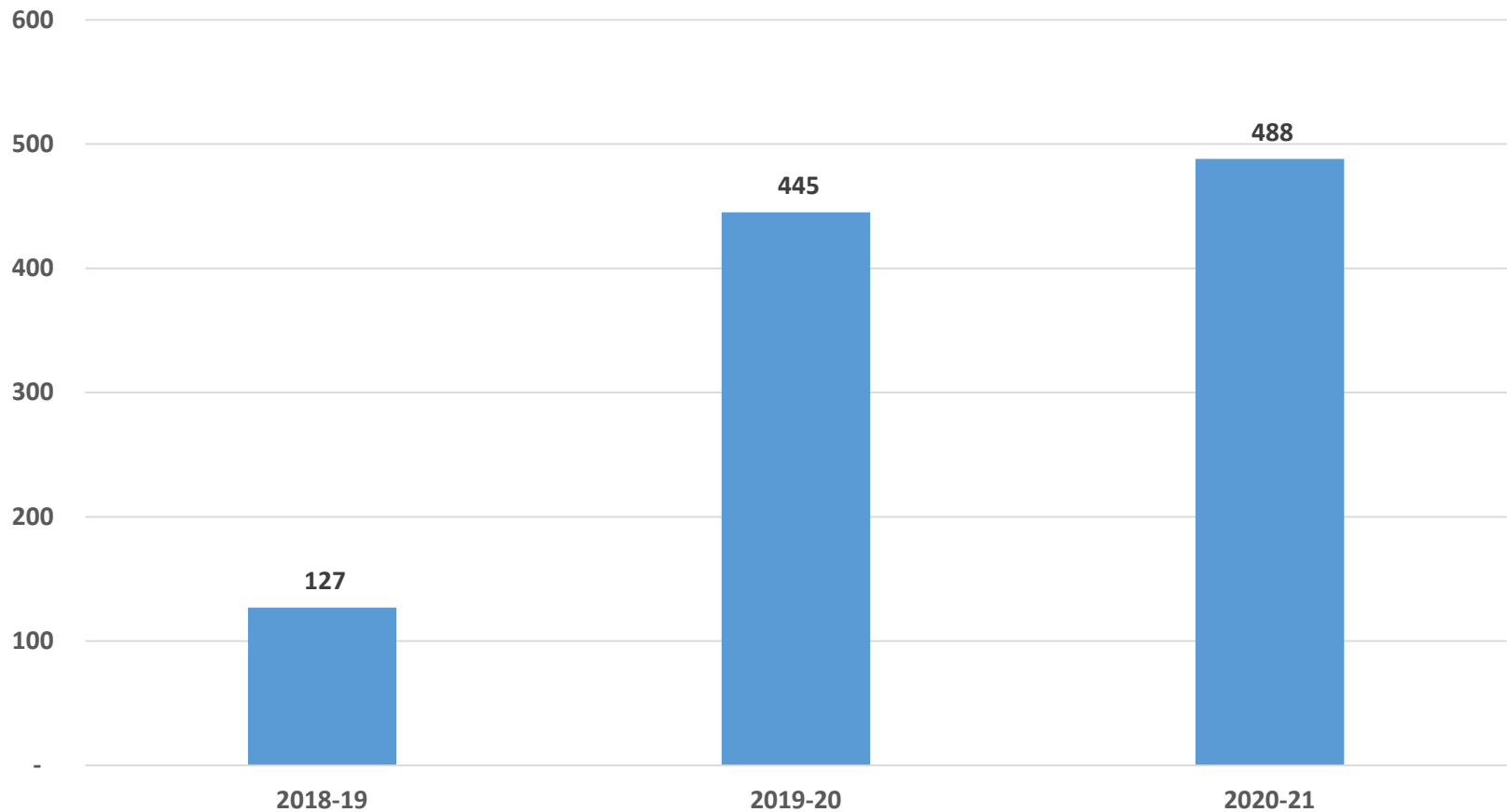

5-Year History of Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Funding

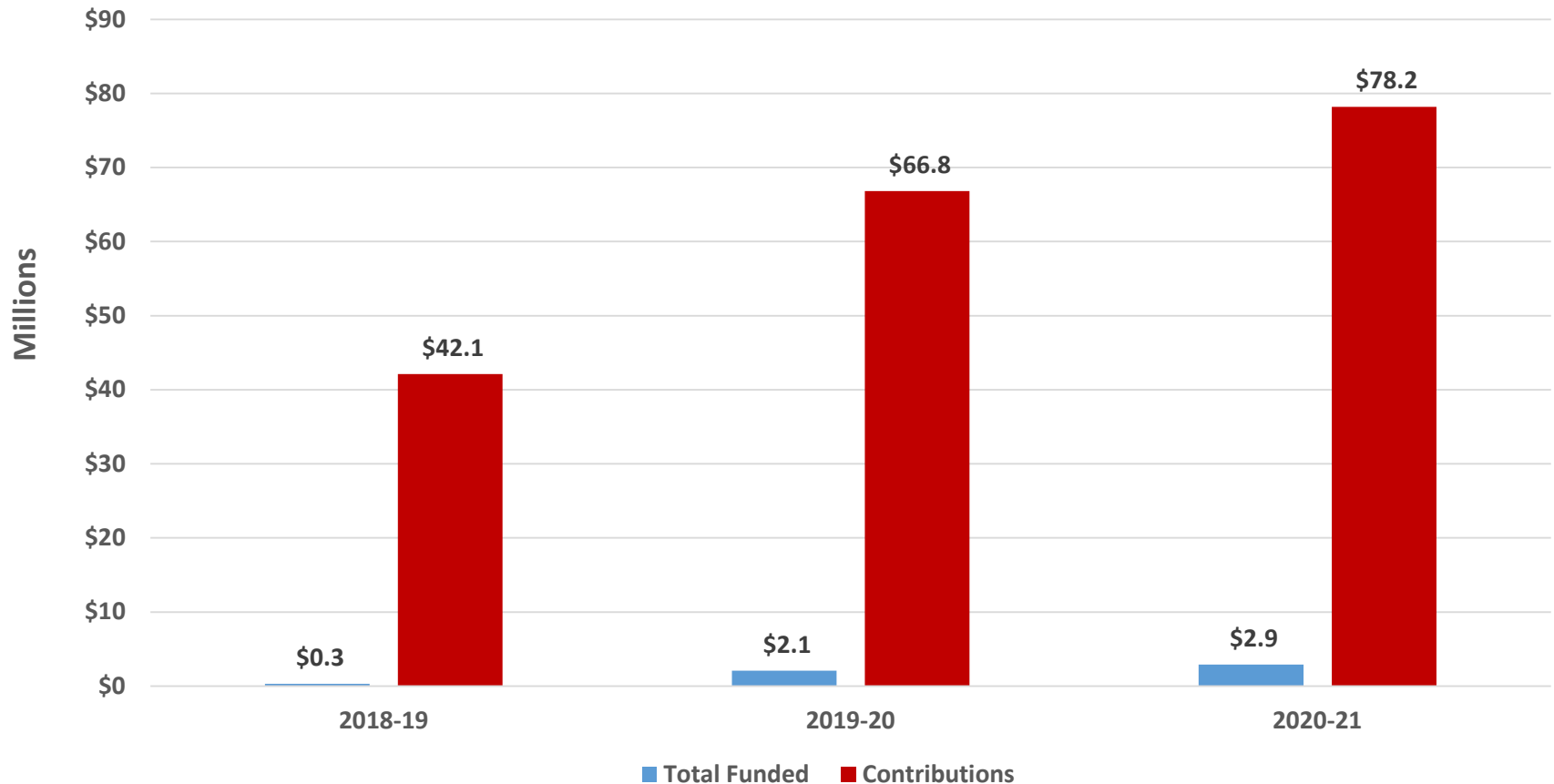


3-Year History of Hope Scholarship Students

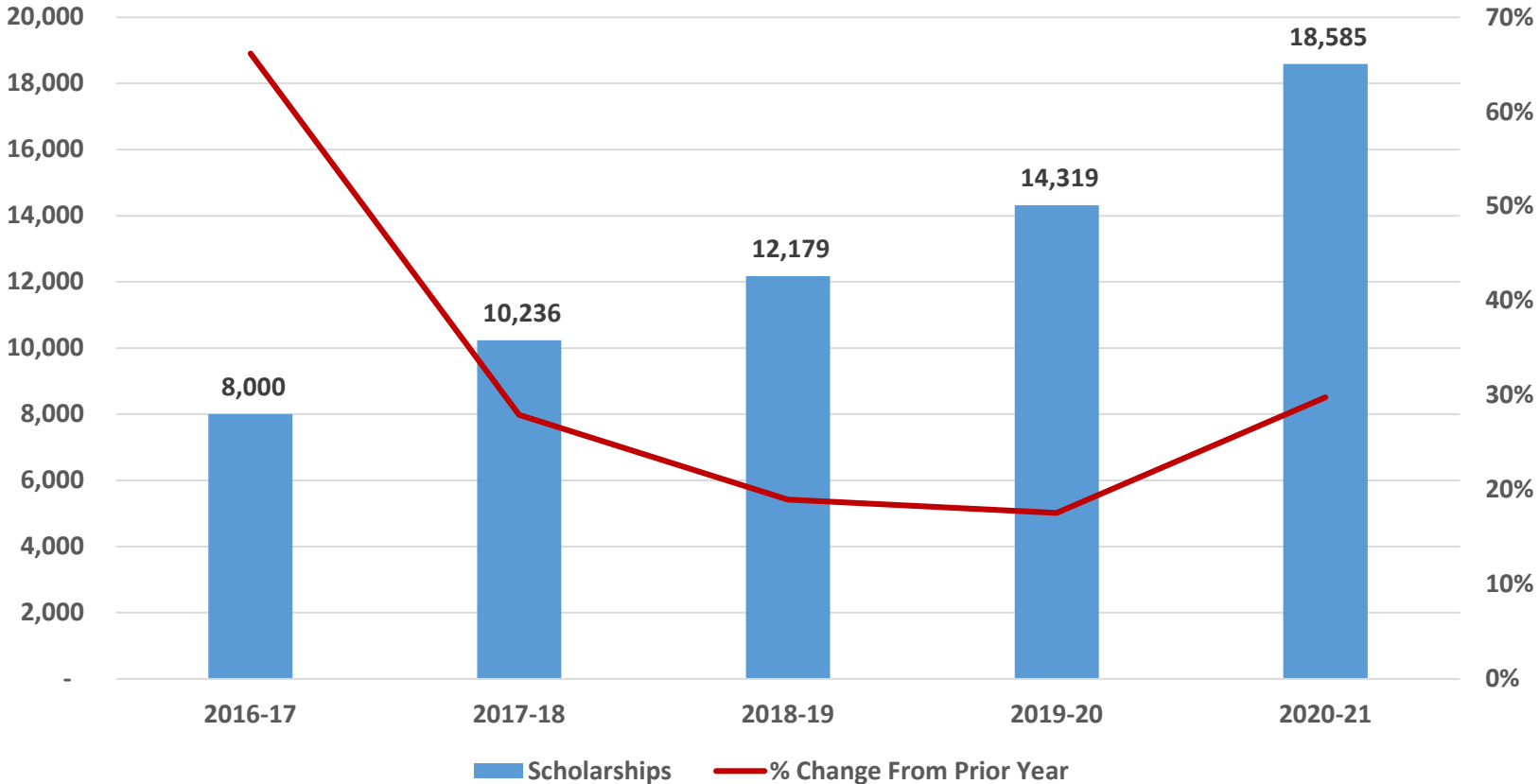

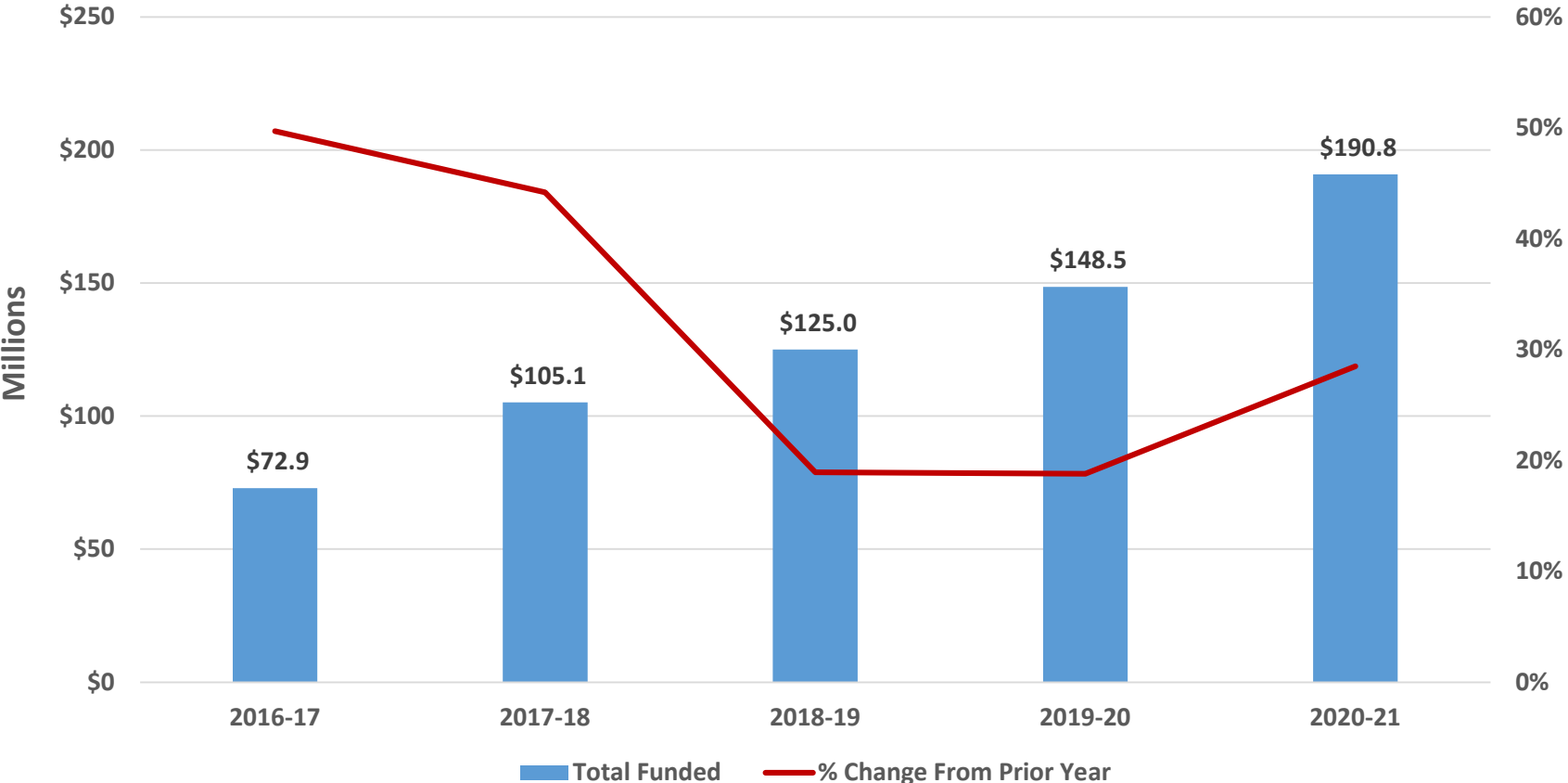


5-Year History of Gardiner Scholarship Students



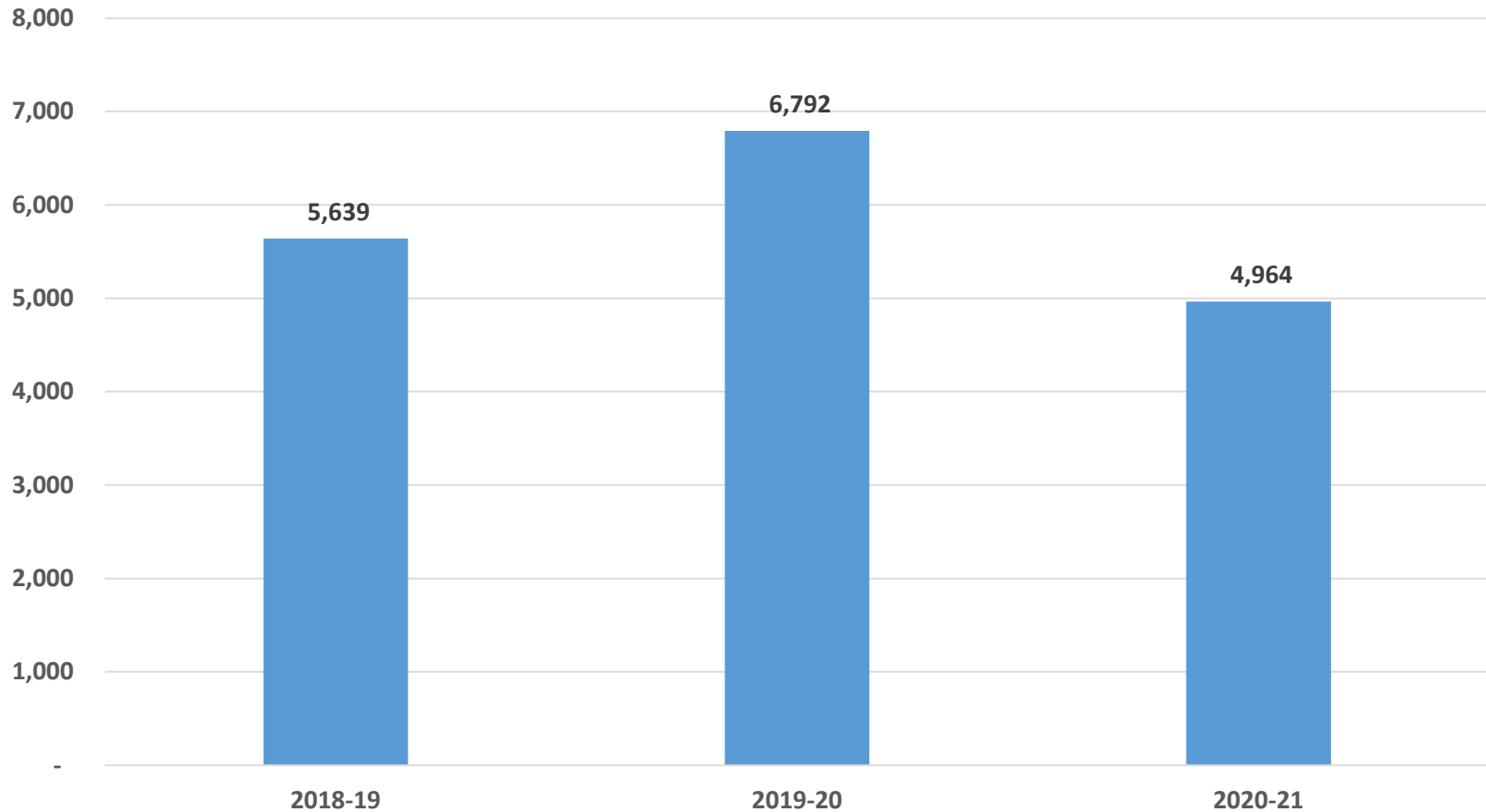

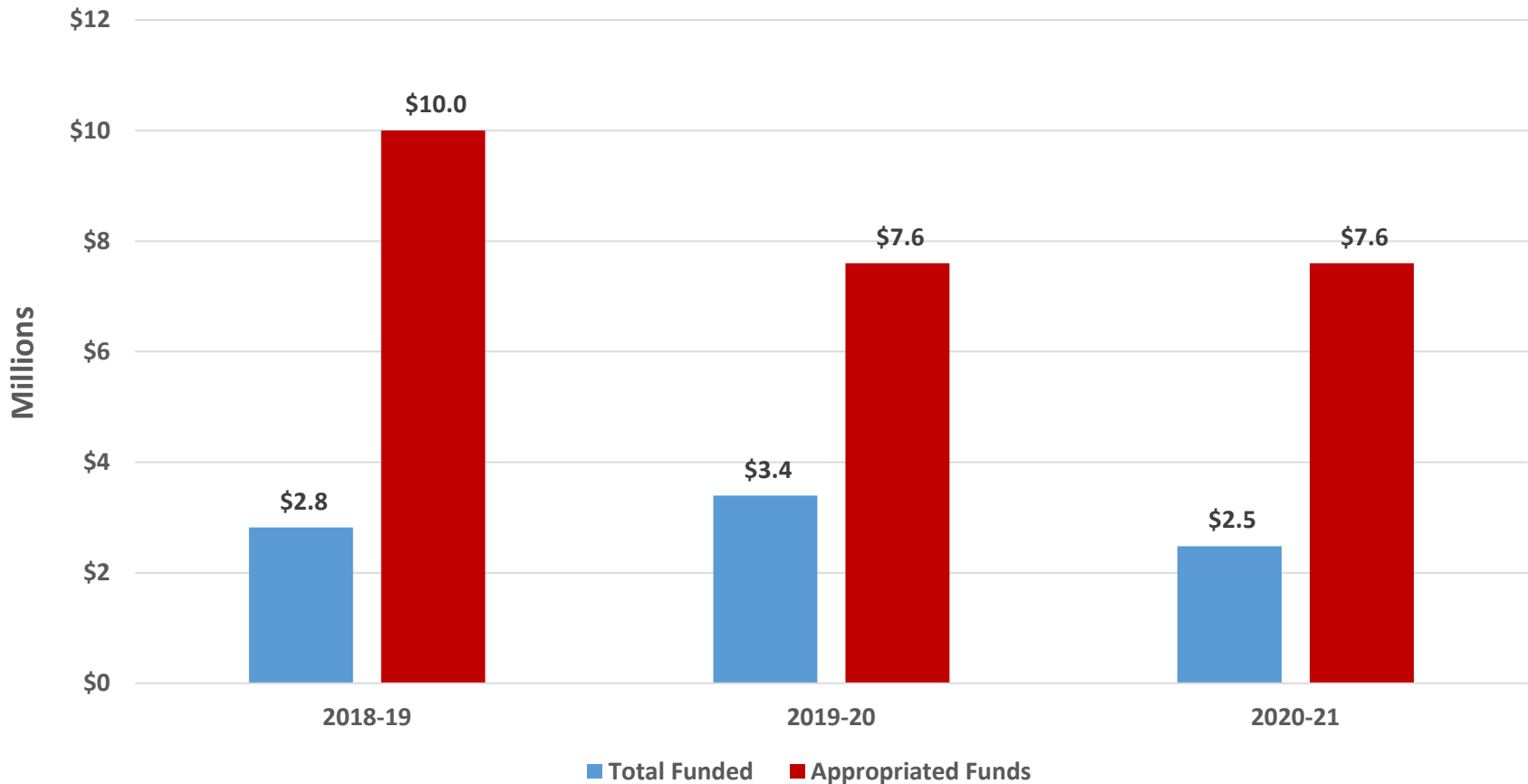
