

Using visually compelling imagery it explores the history of a people who contributed so much to what the region is today. While this project focuses on northern Florida, it is a microcosm of the idea of how slavery shaped all of America. The project benefited from the expertise of faculty from Florida State University and Florida A&M University, as well as the support of local museums and archival resources. The documentary represents a true coming together of community to support the telling of our shared history.

# FEA DA Professional Development Course Descriptions

### Advancing Social Justice Education: A Deeper Understanding of Poverty and Homelessness

Facilitator: Dr. Raji Shankar-Brown

The well-being of children and youth in the sunshine state is consistently ranked as one of the lowest in the nation. This interactive workshop will explore the complex dynamics of economic inequality and education through intersectional lenses, illuminating the layered effects of homelessness on PreK-12 students and families. Participants will be invited to engage in critical reflection, collaborative conversation, and interdisciplinary connection making.

SALON 5 (SESSIONS 2 & 3)

#### **Beyond CETAU**

Facilitators: Tamara Russell, Lake County EA and Michael Woods, Palm Beach County CTA

This session will build on the work of the Creating Equity through Allyship & Understanding modules. It focuses on what it looks like to be a culturally competent teacher in practical application.

Participants will take a deep dive into the aspects of building and maintaining relationships in the early

childhood classroom—understating that relationships are the on-ramp for creating a safe, inclusive and equitable learning environment that embraces the culture and diversity of all community members.

**Marley Dias** 

Activist, Author, Producer

MARLEY DIAS WILL SPEAK DURING THE SECOND GENERAL SESSION ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 14

Marley Dias is an activist, author, contributor, cultural influencer, speaker, founder, and producer known for her passionate advocacy for representation across mediums. Currently a student at Harvard University, Dias also serves as the National Ambassador for NEA's Read Across America campaign where she continues to inspire and empower young people to use their voices to make positive changes in their communities and the world at large.

In 2015, at the age of 11, Dias launched the #1000BlackGirlBooks campaign, which aimed to collect and donate 1,000 books featuring Black girls as the main characters to schools and libraries across the United States. To date more than 13,000 books have been donated to libraries, schools and others in need as part of the campaign.

Her first book, "Marley Dias Gets It Done: And So Can You!" was published in 2018 and became a *New York Times* bestseller. The book is a guide for young people who want to make a difference in the world. In 2020, Dias launched "Bookmarks: Celebrating Black Voices" on Netflix as an Executive Producer. The show, which she hosts, features celebrities reading books that feature Black characters and authors.

In 2017, Dias was given the Smithsonian Ingenuity Award in the Youth Category for her transformative work around representation in literature. Dias was also honored by *TIME* as one of the 25 most influential teens in 2018 and is to date the youngest person to be recognized as part of *Forbes*' "30 Under 30" list.

In addition to an Editorship in Residence at *Elle*, her work has appeared in *Rolling Stone* and *The Harvard Crimson*. Dias has appeared on Ellen, BBC News, CBS This Morning, The Today Show, The View and NPR, and has been profiled in *Teen Vogue*, Refinery29 Unbothered and *Glamour*.


