## Local Referenda

Florida's anti-education politicians have critically underfunded Florida public schools for decades. To help meet the needs of local communities, referenda are placed on the ballot (often through school boards and local unions working together!) to recover crucial dollars for public education that boost salaries and help maintain safe schools.

The following communities have local referenda on the November ballot that will help their communities:

- ✦ Alachua (Millage for school operations)
- ✦ Escambia (Half cent sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ Gulf (Millage for school operations)
- ✦ Hernando (Millage for school operations and half cent sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ Indian River (Millage for school operations)
- ✦ Jackson (half penny sales tax for school infrastructure and technology)
- ✦ Monroe (Millage for school operations and a half cent sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ Manatee (Millage for school operations)
- ✦ Orange (Half penny sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ Sarasota (Millage for operations)
- ✦ Seminole (Penny sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ St. Johns (Half penny sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ St. Lucie (Half penny sales tax for school infrastructure)

### New:

- ✦ Collier (Tax-Neutral)
- ✦ Franklin (Millage for school operations)
- ✦ Hillsborough (Millage for school operations)
- ✦ Marion (Half penny sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ Palm Beach (Half penny sales tax for school infrastructure)
- ✦ Pinellas (Millage increase from half mill to one mill for school operations)
